NICE to meet you!

- ☀ **Conversation Focus** Intensive, highly interactive classes focus on practical communication. Lots of group and pair interaction, mini-presentations, role-plays, discussion.
- ☀ **Levels** Placement tests on first day place students into one of five levels: Basic, High Basic, Intermediate, High Intermediate, Advanced
- ☀ **Interchange** Students meet University of Hawai'i students five times during the course to practice conversation and interact with local students.
- ☀ **Off-campus Activities** The community becomes the classroom during off-campus educational activities that provide interaction with the locals.
- ☀ **American Culture** Language and culture go hand in hand as students learn about American traditions, customs, and values both in and out of the classroom.
- ☀ **Hawaiian Culture** Students learn about the beautiful and unique traditions of Hawai'i in English classes, in a hula lesson, and in the local community.
- ☀ **Optional Excursions** Students may sign up for extra activities held during non-program hours. Cost and other details are provided upon acceptance into program.

NICE CURRICULUM



4 CLASSES

The full-time study program includes four core classes.
Each class meets 50 minutes per day, Monday through Friday. Classes may meet throughout the day between 8:30am and 4:20pm, with most classes in the morning from 8:30am-12:20pm.

GRAMMAR

Work on the structures of English needed to communicate clearly and accurately in writing and speaking, in both formal and informal settings.

Textbook required.

LISTENING

Work on understanding spoken English. Course includes listening to audio/visual material, note-taking skills, and learning new vocabulary.

Textbook required.

ORAL PRODUCTION

Build oral fluency with emphasis on the functions of the language and pronunciation.

Includes **Interchange**: Practice English in small groups with American students throughout the term.

INTEGRATED SKILLS

Use and expand speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills while studying a variety of interesting subjects.

Includes **Community Day**: visit local establishments to practice English and experience the culture.

5 LEVELS

New students are placed into levels based on placement tests given on the first day of the term.
Continuing students are placed based on their class evaluations and teacher assessment of their progress.
Students typically remain in one level for two terms to cover the complete curriculum for each level.

BASIC

Some prior English study, able to comprehend simple vocabulary and communicate with words, short phrases, and gestures.

HIGH BASIC

INTERMEDIATE

ADVANCED

A good grasp of the language, still working on perfecting complex language structures, natural and appropriate use of the language.

Course Goals and Curriculum Themes

All four NICE classes have language learning goals and objectives for each level. In addition, the **Oral Production** and **Integrated Skills** classes are organized around themes related to student's goals for studying English, focusing on academic, professional, or general subject matter. Whenever possible, students with similar goals are grouped together. In classes where student goals are mixed, instructors balance the course material to accommodate the various needs and interests.

Evaluation and Assessment of Progress

At the mid-term and at the end of the term, students receive evaluation and assessment that give students feedback on their progress and help them to set new language learning goals.

NICE students are expected to meet attendance and performance requirements in order to receive a certificate of completion and to remain in the program.

Part-time Study at NICE

Students with limited time to study are welcome to take one, two or three of the core classes, or a NICE elective.

Students on an F-1 student visa must take all four core classes.

TOEFL and TOEIC Preparation and Testing

Each term either a TOEFL or TOEIC test preparation course is offered as an optional elective for an additional fee.

Official institutional TOEFL and TOEIC exams are offered during the last week of every term.

Students meet NICE staff and teachers and make new friends at the **New Student Orientation and Welcome Reception** at the beginning of the term. UHM students lead new students on a **Campus Tour**.



Interchange and the **International Language Exchange** are both great ways to practice real-world English and meet UH students.



The community becomes the classroom on **Community Day** each term.



Some NICE students practice English while providing service through **Volunteer Activities** in the community.



Serious students like to have fun, too! **Social Gatherings** are organized each term.

APPLYING TO NICE 10-WEEK SESSION

Admissions Eligibility

- ☀ NICE welcomes applicants from all countries.
- ☀ NICE accepts students from beginning to advanced levels.
- ☀ Applicants must be 18 years or older by the beginning of the study term.
- ☀ NICE students must be high school graduates.
- ☀ NICE students must be non-native speakers of English.

Visa Requirements

Full-time international students must enter the U.S. on an F-1 student visa. [Full-time study at NICE = 20 hours or more per week.] This school is authorized under Federal Law to enroll non-immigrant alien students. *Persons in the U.S. on a tourist visa (B-2) or visa waiver (WT) are not permitted to study in a 10-week session on a full-time basis.*

Steps to getting an F-1 Student Visa

1. Student submits all application materials, including fees (see below);
2. NICE registers the student into the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS);
3. NICE sends the I-20 Form to the student;
4. The student pays the SEVIS fee online, and makes an appointment for an interview at the nearest American embassy;
5. The student takes the I-20 Form to the interview to obtain a student (F-1) visa.

When To Apply

Students requiring an I-20 Form and F-1 student visa should apply at least ten (10) weeks before the beginning of the study term. Applications are accepted on a first-come-first-served basis until the program is full.

How To Apply (Online or Paper Application)

NOTE: Admission to NICE does NOT equal admission to the University of Hawai'i.

All Applicants must submit:

1. NICE application (paper or online), including photo and signature on Risk & Release section. Apply online at: www.nice.hawaii.edu.
2. Copy of Passport.
3. Full registration and course fees for one session. Pay online with credit card, or mail check/money order payable to "University of Hawaii". Contact NICE office for wire transfer information.
4. Health Certification form filled out and signed by physician. Download form and current requirements from website or request from NICE office.

For applicants who need an F-1 student visa, also submit:

5. Official current financial statement on bank letterhead with name of student or sponsor, name and address of bank, account number, account balance (minimum \$7,400 for 10-week session), signature of bank official. Bank document must be dated within six months before the beginning of the study term.

For transfer students, please also submit:

6. Transfer verification form, signed by designated school official from previous school. Request form from the NICE office.

Application documents may be mailed, faxed or emailed to the NICE office. If faxed or emailed, please also send originals by mail.

Additional Requirements Upon Arrival

All new students must come to the NICE office before the beginning of the study term to complete final registration. Students must bring...

1. **PASSPORT**
The NICE office will photocopy your passport and visa, I-94 card (in your passport), and your I-20 Certificate of Eligibility Form.
2. **PROOF OF MEDICAL INSURANCE**
Medical insurance should be purchased in the student's native country, but may be purchased upon arrival. Students will not be allowed to attend classes without medical insurance. See our website, www.nice.hawaii.edu, for more information.

The term ends with a big celebration. Students are recognized with **Certificates** and awards at a **Graduation** ceremony and lunch on the last day. Students make speeches and offer entertainment.
