



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Course Description

BUS 101 Introduction to Business Fundamentals

This course offers a well-rounded introduction to essential business concepts, incorporating both theoretical and practical aspects. Students will explore key business principles and emerging trends across various fields, such as organizational structure, management, corporate social responsibility, leadership, production, international trade, and supply chain management. Additionally, students will learn effective business communication methods and apply these skills in a project report and presentation. Contemporary business examples will be employed to highlight central themes, customer satisfaction, and change management.

JOB 101 Career Planning

JOB 101, in conjunction with JOB 102, forms a two-part course sequence designed to prepare and guide students as they embark on their career planning and job search journey in Canada. The initial weeks of JOB 101 guide students in assessing and reflecting upon their qualities, values, skills, education, and experience, and how these aspects connect to their career goals. The course then shifts its focus to the Canadian job market and employer recruitment processes. The final week emphasizes job search strategies, both face-to-face and online. (Refer to the JOB 102 desoription for further career planning).

JOB 102 Job Readiness

This course is designed to prepare and guide students as they embark on their career planning and job search journey in Canada. The first week emphasizes the importance of analyzing job postings and organizations to create highquality, tailored resumes and cover letters for specific positions. Subsequent weeks focus on developing interviewing skills for various formats, such as telephone, videoconferencing, and in-person interviews. In the final weeks, students will learn effective job offer negotiation strategies and how to adapt to organizational communication and protocol norms. By the end of the course, students will have assembled a comprehensive job search portfolio, setting the foundation for successful career planning, and launching in the Canadian job market.

MGT 114 Human Resource Management

In this course, students will acquire a robust foundation in supervising, managing, and leading small teams with an emphasis on practical application over theoretical concepts. The lessons are organized into three main parts. Part 1 concentrates on the collaboration between managers and HR personnel to build, onboard, train, and support teams. Part 2 delves into managing employee performance, encompassing international and intercultural considerations. Part 3 focuses on effective leadership practices for managers, including conflict resolution techniques. Upon successful completion, students will have the ability to describe the roles of HR departments and team managers, formulate strategies for building and managing diverse and multicultural teams, design comprehensive training plans,

develop employee assessment systems, and exhibit effective communication and conflict resolution skills.

SYS101 Business Information Systems and Analytics

In this course, students will examine the collection, analysis, and utilization of business information for decision-making. The curriculum focuses on ¹⁾ Excel, ²⁾ accounting/financial systems, and ³⁾ integration of business information systems such as customer management and enterprise resource management systems. Students will develop skills in using Excel for dynamic spreadsheets, charts, and PivotTables, understand basic accounting principles and financial ratios, and gain insights into the functionality, types, and components of various ERP systems. These essential skills will empower students to make informed business decisions.

MKS 110 Sales and Product Strategies

This course presents students with an extensive understanding of marketing principles and practices, laying a solid foundation in the discipline. The lessons cover crucial components such as market planning, intelligence, segmentation, consumer behavior, product management, pricing, and supply chain management. Upon successful completion, students will be proficient in applying behavioral theories to consumer purchasing and loyalty, as well as possessing a profound understanding of the factors that shape product management, pricing, and distribution strategies. This foundational knowledge serves as a stepping stone for MKS 111, where the emphasis is on incorporating technology into marketing strategy formulation and planning processes.


MKS 111 Social Media Marketing

This course provides students with a comprehensive understanding of technology's role in marketing strategies and planning. The course explores current trends and technologies, delving into promotional activities, public relations, experiential marketing, sales processes, website design, and social media marketing, as well as marketing metrics. Additionally, students will investigate emerging trends like personalization, influencers, account-based marketing, the Internet of Things, and voice-enabled platforms. Upon completion, students will create a marketing plan with sample media, showcasing their ability to leverage advanced marketing tools and technologies in this rapidly evolving field.

MGT 130 Foundations of Project Management

This course aims to equip students with both technical and managerial skills necessary to lead programs and projects in compliance with Project Management Institute's guidelines. Students will learn various project management skills and strategies. Upon completion, students will be able to describe project management processes, identify elements of the project management life cycle, perform basic tools and techniques to organize, plan and manage a project, and optimize results while managing triple constraints.







ESL Program Policies & Procedures

Admission Policy

To be admitted to the Connect International School, prospective students must submit a valid copy of passport and a signed copy of the registration form. In the case of minors, a parent or quardian must also sign the registration form. Minimum age of general English studies is 16 years old except High School Preparation, Family English and Junior English courses.

Admission Requirement

All students must have a legal status in Canada and valid medical insurance while they are studying.

For programs or courses over six months, students must have a valid study permit.

For short-term courses of programs. students can study without study permit if the tudy duration is six months or less; and students will complete their course or studies within the time they are allowed to stav in Canada.

Study Cancellation and Tuition Refund Policy

- 1. Refunds before the program starts:
- a. If the institution receives a notice of withdrawal within 7 days after the contract is made, and before the program start date, the institution may retain 10% of the tuition due.
- b. If the institution receives a notice of withdrawal 30 days or more before the program start date, the institution may retain 20% of the tuition due;
- c. If the institution receives a notice of withdrawal less than 30 days before the program start date, the institution may retain 30% of the tuition due.
- 2. Refunds after the program starts: a. If the institution receives a notice of withdrawal less than 10% of program completed, the institution may retain up to 50% of the unused tuition due; b. If the institution receives a notice of withdrawal where 10-30% of program completed, the institution may retain up to 70% of the unused tuition due: c. If the institution receives a notice of withdrawal more than 30% of program completed, no student refund is required.

3. Refunds relating to Study Permit or Visa:

a. If a student's Study Permit has not been issued by the start date indicated in the institution's Letter of Acceptance and the student so notifies the institution, at the request of the student, the institution may issue a second Letter of Acceptance for a later

requested start date

- i. The institution may charge the student an additional \$200 administrative fee and retain the balance of the prepaid tuition fees pending the outcome of the Study Permit application.
- ii. A student fails to notify to the institution, the refund policy set out in Section 2.a will apply.
- b. If the Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada deny a student's Study Permit, the School may retain the lesser of 20% or \$400. i. A electronic copy of the Study
- Permit or Visa refusal letter must be provided prior to the program start date as set out in the institution's most recently issued Letter of Acceptance.
- ii. A student fails to notify to School, or decides to withdraw for other reasons, the refund policy set out in Section 2.a will apply.
- 4. Other Refund Policy Requirements: a. Where a student withdraws from their program after receiving technical equipment from the School i. The student must return the
 - equipment as the way it was given to the student on the same date that a completed withdrawal form is submitted: and
 - ii. If the student fails to return the equipment as the way it was given to the student, the School may deduct the reasonable cost of the equipment from any amount to be refunded to the student
- b. Refunds owed to students must be paid within 30 days of the institution receiving written notification of withdrawal, technical equipment, if applicable, and all required supporting documentation.
- c. If the institution receives tuition from the student, or a person on behalf of the student, the institution will refund the student, or the person who paid on behalf of the student.
- 5. A student may be entitled to a refund of tuition fees in the event that the student provides written notice of cancellation form
- 6. All refunds are made to the original fee paver
- 7. All refunds will be made within 30 days from the date that written cancellation is received
- 8. Non-refundable fees are not refunded in any cases.
- 9. Any or all changes of lessons/programs are considered the same as cancellation.

For instance, if a student would like to change their lesson type from 27 lessons per week to 20 lessons per week, the whole program is cancelled and re-apply for the newer lessons and refund policy will be applied.

- 10. Any or all changes of number of lessons/ programs by Connect International School are credited based on tuition and fees as listed in the finally issued student invoice. No cash refunds will be made for these changes.
- 11. Courses are not transferable to a third party.

Accommodation Cancellation and **Refund Policy (ESL & Vocational** Programs)

- 1. Accommodation cancellation before move-in: If a student wishes to cancel accommodation, they must give 4 weeks prior to the move-in date with written notice. This makes a student be entitled to get homestay fee refund. In case of Study Permit or Visa refusal, the same rule is applied.
- 2. Accommodation cancellation after move-in: If a student wishes to cancel accommodation after move-in, a 4 weeks' advance written notice must be submitted for homestay fee refund. If the 4-week notice period is not provided a cancellation fee equal to 4 weeks of the accommodation cost will apply.

Airport Transfer Cancellation and Refund Policy (ESL & Vocational Programs)

- 1. Arrival flight details including arrival time and date, flight numbers, airline and point of origin must be submitted at least 7 business days prior to arrival. If it is not provided to the school, no refunds will be granted on transfers.
- 2. If a student cancels Airport Transfer within 24 hours of arrival will be charged in full.

Vocational Program Policies & Procedures

Admission Policy and Admission Requirement

To be admitted to any Connect International School vocational program, prospective students must meet our admission requirement:

Academic

- Have an Ontario Secondary School Diploma or equivalent; OR
- · Be at least 18 years old and pass a qualifying test approved by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities.

English Language Proficiency

- IELTS 5.5 (official test score) OR
- Successful completion of CIS' English level B2+ higher
- Successful completion of a 1-year recognized, full-time post-secondary education (not language training) in English in an English speaking country 75% or better

Study Cancellation and Tuition Refund Policy

Full Refunds

In any of the following circumstances, students have a choice of cancelling a contract and making a written request for a full refund of fees paid for a program or accepting the shortcoming and continuing training with CIS:

- a) CIS, while still operating, discontinues the vocational program before the student completes the program
- b) CIS charges or collects fees of more than 20% of the total fees for the program, or 25% in the case of international students, to a maximum of \$500 before signing a contract with students.
- c) CIS expels the student from the college in a manner or for reasons that are contrary to the college's expulsion policy
- d) A total of more than 10% of the program is taught by unqualified instructors
- e) If CIS, or its representatives, make untrue statements for the purpose of influencing students to enrol and the statements constitute a fundamental breach of contract. Categories of inappropriate statements include: a false or misleading statement, a statement that guarantees admission or successful completion of the program, employment after graduation or the right to enter Canada or receive a student visa.
- f) If CIS charges or collects a compulsory fee that is not published on the ServiceOntario website or that is higher than what is published, students are entitled to a full refund of the unpublished fees or the

difference in amount between what is published and what was collected.

A full refund is not payable in the circumstances of the discontinuance of the vocational program coincides with the private career college ceasing to operate.

A refund is not payable unless the student gives CIS a written demand for the refund.

A refund is payable by CIS within 30 days of the day the student delivers to the college.

Partial Refund Before a Program Begins

Students are entitled to a refund of fees paid for a program, except that CIS is allowed to retain 20% of the total fees for the program or \$500, whichever is less if:

- a) The student gives the college notice that he or she is withdrawing from the program before the day the vocational program commences.
- b) A student does not meet the program's begins.
 - c) CIS cancels the contract for the program within 45 days of the start of the program because a student does not attend the first 14 days of classes.
 - d) The student is unable to obtain a student visa to enter Canada. Note that written notice must be received by CIS before half the portion of a program has passed.

Partial Refund After a Program Begins

Programs that are shorter than 12 months:

that CIS is allowed to retain 20% of the total fees for the program or \$500, whichever is less, plus fees earned by the college for the

b) CIS is not obligated to issue students any refund of fees for a program if students withdraw from the program after half the program has passed.

c) CIS is required to provide students with the result of at least one evaluation before half the program has been delivered.

Partial Refund After a Program Begins

Programs that are 12 months or longer:

a) Programs that are 12 months or longer are broken into 12-month periods for the purpose of calculating the refund. After the last 12-month period of a program has passed, the calculation is based on the



- admission requirements before the program

- a) When students withdraw from a program after the program begins, they are entitled to a refund of fees paid for the program, except part of the program that has been delivered.

remaining length of the program.

- b) For the current 12-month period in which students are in attendance, they are entitled to a refund of fees paid for that period, except that CIS is allowed to retain 20% of the total fees for the program or \$500, whichever is less, plus fees earned by the college for the part of the program that has been delivered. In addition, students are entitled for a full refund of fees paid for any subsequent periods that have not begun at the time of withdrawal.
- c) If a student withdraws mid-week and more than half of the classes in a week have been delivered by CIS, the entire week is deemed delivered.
- d) CIS is required to provide students with the result of at least one evaluation before half a 12-month period has passed.
- e) CIS is not obligated to issue students any refund of fees paid for a 12-month period of a program if students withdraw after half of that period has passed. However, students are still entitled to a full refund of fees paid for any subsequent periods that have not begun at the time of withdrawal.

Fee Collection | International Students

- a) CIS will only charge or collect fees for a program in Canadian dollars.
- b) CIS charges and collects compulsory fees for a program as published on the ServiceOntario website, and never higher than what is published.
- c) After international students sign a contract, CIS may not collect more than 25% of the total fees for a program from the students before the program begins.
- d) CIS is required to hold the money in a trust account until the international student begins the program.

Treatment Of Books And Equipment

In calculating a refund, CIS may retain the retail cost of books or equipment that the college supplied to the student if the student:

- a) Fails to return the books or equipment to CIS within 10 days of the student's withdrawal or expulsion from the program; or
- b) Returns the books or equipment to CIS within the 10-day period but fails to return it unopened or in the same state it was in when supplied.
